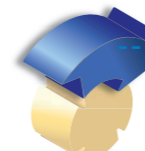

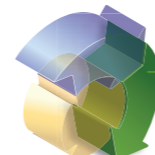

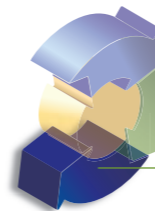
OVERVIEW – This section contains a description of a Workplace Safety and Health Program, including access to Legislation.



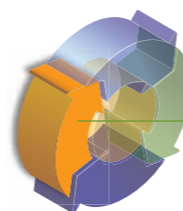
DEVELOP – Information and guidance is given for each of the required 11 Core Elements, including tools and resources.



IMPLEMENT – Responsibilities and accountabilities for implementing and maintaining the elements can be assigned to the appropriate people, departments, and/or groups in your company.



MANAGE – Upload your workplace policies, procedures, records, and other resources, so that all workers have access.



ASSESS – Ensure your workplace safety and health program is working effectively and meeting legislative requirements.
